I hate saying that, as it shouldn't be a numbers game, but the spiritual impact seems to increase as the number of men get turned on to Christ increases. Having said this, I do know how difficult is to get men to commit to a weekend that is not high on their priority list. I have to constantly remind myself of what is written in Luke 10: 1-3

After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. ² He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field. ³ Go! I am sending you out like lambs among wolves.

The 72 disciples are long gone from this earth. We are His disciples now. In this parable it is easy to miss the importance of the first line. Jesus said, He sent them out ahead of Him. This means He followed them after they prepared men to hear and accept His message. The same thing happens today when we ask someone to join us on our walk. The Lord is with us but he also stays with the seed we planted in their mind with the invitation. He dwells within them and nurtures the seed long after they have given us their response. Yes or no makes no difference.

Our role is to continue to pray for the men we have shared our journey with, even as we move on to the next person (or town in the disciple's case). We cannot get discouraged as it is in God's hands once we have responded to His call to be a disciple. We need to continue on our journey by offering the opportunity to new friends, just as the disciples moved on to other towns. They knew the Lord was with them and would follow behind them. He is with us and will follow behind us. Our job is to go forth and be the good news .
